Please bring the confirmation along with the exact number of children, teachers and chaperones on the day of your visit. **Reservations and a contract are required in advance of your visit.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Field Trips may be scheduled Tuesday-Friday.
- Group size is limited to 100 children. ESY Group size is limited to 60 children.
- Cost is \$6 per child.
- You must have 10 or more children from a church, school or daycare to qualify for a group rate.
- We require one adult chaperone for every five children.
- All required adults are all FREE, including bus drivers, teachers and required chaperones! All other chaperones pay the \$6.00 group rate.
- We accept the following forms of payment: cash, check, Amex, Visa, MasterCard, or a PO number.
- Museum members who visit with a group must also pay the group rate of \$6.00 each.
- GCM Memberships, coupons and discounts do not apply.
- On-site parking is free and can accommodate buses.
- Groups can bring lunches to eat in one of our large activity rooms (when available) or reserve a spot outside in our backyard on picnic tables. We can also suggest nearby restaurants that can provide lunch for pick up or delivery.

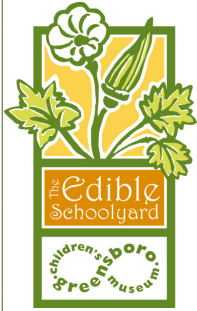

Urban Farmer I (Grades Pre-K-K) (Spring, Summer, and Fall)
